Another year has come and gone within the Tau Phi Delta and Greek community. I hope that all of you had a fantastic fall with enjoyment from great PSU football and hunting seasons. I was recently elected as the active Phi and am both honored and very excited to assume my role in serving the Actives of our great fraternity.

After serving as Alpha Phi on our Executive Board for the previous year, I had familiarized myself with much of what responsibilities the Phi has, and hope to execute my duties to the best of my ability.

Thanks to the major efforts put in by the former Executive Board, and with the support from the Active Brotherhood last year, I am proud to say we met the standard in three-quarters of the categories for IFC Standards of Excellence for the year 2017; this is something only 18 out of 38 of the recognized fraternities met. So job well done to the former Executives: Phi Nathan Yocum, Tau Keith Thomas, and Sigma Chris Barnish.

Unfortunately, with new recruiting measures set by the University preventing first semester freshmen from pledging in the fall, recruiting was hard to come by for this past semester. We were still able to welcome 5 new quality Brothers into the mix between both the Spring and Fall 2017 classes, leaving us with 23 Active Brothers. In addition, we have 4 pledges this semester who are currently going through the pledge process. We will continue to make strides at recruiting new members in order to keep this great fraternity going.

Regarding the Penn State Greek community, many new regulations have been enacted over the past two semesters. The social ban has been lifted as of November 2017, which was in effect since February 2017. Under current rules, each fraternity may only have 10 social events per semester, which is down from the former 45; these social events must also be registered with the University 10 days in advance. In addition, the pledge process can now only be 6 weeks long, and potential new members must go through several seminars (i.e., on hazing, sexual assault, alcohol) before they can receive a bid. They must also attend several other related seminars during the 6-week process. Although challenging at times, it has gone relatively smooth over the last 2 semesters, and I hope it continues to go that way.

Finally, I want to thank all the Alumni and Actives for making Tau Phi Delta such a great organization. If it weren't for the great efforts that we all put forth, it wouldn't be what it is today. With the installation of new backboards, stakes, sand, and groundboards, a game of horseshoes has gained much popularity during a beautiful central Pennsylvania afternoon. Not to mention, the new light fixtures along the fence make night games a regular “brotherly” event.

All in all, the past two pledge projects have given the House a cleaner cosmetic look as well as bring the Brotherhood closer together. There are also high hopes set for the Spring 2018 pledge class as we hope to initiate four new members.

During this current semester, we wish to fix all the minor problems that arise, and improve some aspects of the house. Besides minor sink fixes, light fixture replacements, and water pump issues that have arisen in regards to the boiler, the Little Sister bathroom has received a mini renovation. This includes the installation of a SmartCore© wood floor, new toilet, and vanity.

This project has been long overdue and, in my opinion, was a nice gesture from us to our Little Sisters and female guests. There has been past issues with the old sink and toilet, and the Brothers decided it is easier to replace them. The Little Sisters have since been up-keeping the bathroom and are reorganizing their suite.

The spring semester of 2018 has proven to be a prosperous one for the Brothers of TΦΔ. With a roster of 23 Active Brothers and four prospective members, the semester looks to be promising.

In regards to the House roster, 17 Members currently reside at 427 East Fairmount Avenue, including 16 Actives and one perspective member (Pledge).

For the coming fall semester the House roster should be 18 Actives living in-house.

The current House Bill stands at \$4,300 for in-house living, while Brothers living outside of the House pay \$650 with an optional meal plan.

These numbers have allowed us to properly manage their finances through conscientious spending and an increased importance on responsibility.

As far as expenditures on repairs, Tau Phi Delta has had to make some payments since the last newsletter. The boiler room has had some attention in the past few months with multiple parts needing to get repaired or replaced.

Both the Spring and Fall 2017 Pledge Classes have done a lot in regards to their respective pledge projects. These new improvements have proven to be fun and beneficial to TΦΔ.

New blunders and problems are bound to occur, but I am confident that the Brotherhood will be able to meet these challenges accordingly, as well as maintain a proficient financial standing throughout the semester and the summer.
